- ² "Number Who Passed First Exam Taken" is the number of graduates who took and passed the licensing exam in the reported calendar year on the first attempt.
- ³ "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who pass the exam the first time they take it by the number of graduates who took the licensing exam for the first time after completion of the program.
